**Clackamas Community College
Paraeducator Certificate Program
Transfer Agreement with Portland State University**

Graduates from Clackamas Community College's Paraeducator Certificate Program who have completed the Associate of General Studies degree program may transfer to Portland State University with the following understandings:

1. They will first contact an academic adviser at Clackamas Community College, 503-657-6958, ext. 2550. They will have been advised about meeting either the B.S. requirements (12 credits of arts and letters and/or social sciences + 4 credits in college-level math/stat + 12 credits of science, 8 of which must have lab or field work (28 credit hours total), or the B.A. requirements (12 credits of arts and letters with a minimum of 4 credits in fine and performing arts + 12 credits of science and/or social science distribution area with a minimum of 4 credit in the sciences and 4 credits in foreign language numbered 203 or higher (28 credit total).
2. They will contact the PSU College of Liberal Arts and Sciences Advising Office, 725-3822 to schedule an advising and transcript evaluation appointment. They will be evaluated for either the B.A. or B.S. in Arts and Letters or in Social Sciences (though they may select from the range of majors for which they meet pre-requisites).
3. Those students completing their AGS at Clackamas who express an interest in pursuing their teaching license in early childhood, elementary, or special education will have been advised about preparation for graduate teacher education. They will have been advised to complete Math 211 & Math 212 (Math 213 strongly recommended); to take PSY 215, MUS 110, and to take US history as part of their social science requirements. Additionally, they will choose elective courses which represent the range of the elementary curriculum.
4. Those students interested in the mid-level and high school level teaching authorization typically major in the subject they wish to teach, and should include any lower division pre-requisites for the major and endorsement area within their AGS program of study.
5. Provided that there are at least 90 transferable credits, they will be admitted with Junior status relative to placement in general education.
