The Clackamas Community College (CCC) Medical Assistant (MA) Program offers a broad-based curriculum focused on meeting the demands of healthcare today. The MA profession is a demanding discipline, and the course of study is as challenging as it is rewarding. We urge you to recognize the dedication and commitment that is essential to be successful in this program.

Begin your application process as early as possible so that you have ample time to complete the requirements and the application packet. Please thoroughly review the contents of the packet and supporting documents prior to submitting your application. CCC Admission Policy Statement

CCC supports an open-door policy and welcomes all students who can benefit from the instruction offered, regardless of their educational background. Prospective students are eligible for admission if they are a high school graduate or have earned a GED. Admission to the College does not guarantee entrance to all programs.

Students seeking to enter this special admit program must meet additional admission criteria including Oregon statutory mandates for all healthcare students and providers:

- Must not have been convicted of, pleaded guilty to or currently charged with a felony; and they
 must pass a criminal history background check and a Urine Drug Screen to enter the program
 and once again to be released for externship
 - Individuals who have been found guilty of a felony or have pleaded guilty to a felony, and/or have failed the Urine Drug Screen, will not be eligible to take part in the program or program externship requirements and thus unable to sit for the national certification exam. If you have questions about criminal history disqualifiers, please reference the "Provider Crime Lists" on the Department of Human Services website (<u>http://www.oregon.gov/dhs/chc/pages/tools.aspx</u>) for detailed information.
- Provide official documentation that the student will be at least 18 years of age prior to beginning his/her externship experience in third term 2022.
- Provide and submit Oregon Health Authority (OHA) required documents within the specified time frame of the multiphase application process. Document requirements are clearly noted in the following application

NOTE: Any student that does not meet the above criteria will not be admitted into the 2021 - 2022 MA Program. Please email us with any questions about the above requirements.

About the program: The MA program consists of three terms of full-time study with the addition of two prerequisite courses. Applicants are advised that a high level of dexterity, the ability to multitask and "think on your feet" (critical thinking skills), increased physical and mental stamina, along with a high degree of 'attention to detail' are required for the successful completion of the MA Program. Successful students are required to complete an administrative and clinical practicum within an ambulatory care setting in the Portland metro area. Students are placed in a variety of settings which may include family practice, immediate care, internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, pediatrics, or other specialty practices.

According to the annual survey of graduates, students in the MA Program at CCC are satisfied with the education that they receive, as there is an average of 100% graduate satisfaction rate over the past five years.

Medical Assistant Program Accreditation

The CCC MA Program is designed to prepare students for entry level positions in the ambulatory care setting. The goal of this program is to graduate students who have successfully demonstrated the ability to meet required competency in administrative and clinical practices, positive work ethics, and the ability to communicate effectively while demonstrating professional values and behaviors that are consistent with the requirements of the MA Educational Review Board (CAAHEP).

Getting Started

It is strongly suggested that each candidate *meet with an advisor and review the application in its entirety* before initializing the application process. Your attention to detail and your ability to follow directions will assist you in successfully completing the required four phases in a timely manner and in the acceptance process.

Remember: Only completed applications that follow the application phases and deadlines will be considered for admission approval. Read carefully and completed each phase in it's entirely.

Limited Entry Program ADMISSIONS

- Eligibility for admission to the MA Program will be based on the current stated criteria. Spaces are limited to 24 students; therefore, eligibility does not guarantee admission to the program. Submitting an application does not guarantee that applicants have satisfied minimum criteria.
- Allied Health personnel will evaluate each application and supporting documents for eligibility requirements.
- Prerequisites must be completed no later than 12 June 2021 the end of Spring Term. However, students can still apply as long as these pre-reqs are completed in summer term. Those students will be placed on a wait list while they complete these courses.
- The Allied Heath team routinely monitors completion of prerequisite courses and Phase requirements.
- Any application submitted after the deadline will be considered on a space-available basis at the discretion of both the Department of Health Sciences and the Registrar's Office.
- Admissions criteria are subject to change from year to year; therefore, it is the responsibility of the student candidate to gather up-to-date information and stay informed.
- The Health Sciences Department reserves the right to establish an alternate (wait) list. Students on the alternate list will be notified <u>when and if</u> space becomes available for them to begin the MA program in Fall of 2021.
- Clackamas Community College reserves the right to modify the criteria and the process for selection.

Certification exam: Earning the CMA (AAMA) credential

Upon successful program completion, national certification examination is offered through the American Association of Medical Assistants (AAMA) at <u>www.aama-ntl.org</u> Check the website for details. Registration for the AAMA exam is a <u>graduation requirement</u>. The expected cost is \$125 which will be due March 2022.

2021–2022 Medical Assistant Program Admission Process

This application process is for the 2021 academic year, as outlined below. Applicants must follow and successfully complete all steps to be invited to continue through each phase of the admission process, with the final phase resulting in the opportunity to be for admission to the MA Program.

Clackamas Community College awards more than \$500,000 in scholarships each year. The Financial Aid department offers two rounds of scholarships each academic year. The scholarship application for the 2021-2022 academic year is open from Jan. 30 through Nov. 1. There are two

scholarship deadlines: April 12 and Nov. 1. Students who apply for a round 1 scholarship will automatically be considered for round 2 if student does not receive an awarded in round 1. PHASE 1: The MA APPLICATION PACKET 01 February – 20 June 2021

- Mailed application packets must be received no later than 20 June 2021

 Contents must be contained in an manila envelope; postmarks not accepted. *It is imperative that you write legibly.* Please note: All communications will occur using the email address you provide on your application. Write legibly and submit an email address that you check regularly. Once the program starts students will need to use their school email.
- **Math competency.** Coursework equivalent to Math-65 or higher as shown on college transcripts with a grade C of better; or math placement higher than Math-65. Placement assessment should be within the last three (3) academic years.

 Official College Transcripts are required for coursework completed at other colleges / universities other than CCC. Official transcripts should be sealed and submitted with a candidate's MA application. Letter of Recommendation: The letter should originate from a credentialed healthcare, academic professional, and/or a professional in your work place, community or volunteer site with whom you are well-acquainted (<u>no family members</u>).

This letter should address the likelihood of your success within this field of study by discussing the following topics:

- Initiative, punctuality, work quality, dependability, emotional maturity, and critical thinking skill *
- These areas will be addressed by the author for successful rubric scoring of the Letter of Recommendation. The letter will be graded against the following simple rubric:
 - Fails to meet Meets Exceeds criteria.
- This letter must be on letterhead or include professional business card (stapled to the letter) and be signed by the originator.
- The letter should be directed to: Allied Health Admissions Team
- The Letter of Recommendation must be placed in a sealed envelope with the name of the candidate printed on the front. If due to COVD your letter can not be mailed in time. - Non-refundable application fee: \$50 (please make checks or money orders payable to Clackamas Community College – in the "memo" you may put Medical Assistant Application Fee)

- Please make sure that you are in a distraction free environment as this is a professional meeting.
- You will need a notebook in order to take notes during the meeting.

Section 1: 8:30 -11:30am The purpose of the Mandatory Information Session (MIS) is to review the application process and inform candidates of the necessary Oregon Health Authority requirements contained in Phases 3 and 4 of the MA application process. Failure to attend the MIS in its entirety and/or displays of unprofessional behavior during the orientation may preclude the candidate from moving forward in the application process.

Section 2: 11:30-Noon Phase 2 Essay completion

Candidates that have attended the Mandatory Information Session in its entirety will then be given the opportunity to complete the informational essay for rubric scoring during the last 30 minutes of the MIS. Remember to use a computer, not a tablet or cell phone, to attend the Zoom Information Session and to complete your essay. Spelling and Grammar count.

You will receive specific instructions on how to complete your thirty-minute informational essay. The essay will be completed using a PC/laptop and consist of 400 words; topic information will be presented at the time of Essay at the end of the Mandatory Information Session. After the 30-minute time frame is complete, you will email your essay to the MA program Director, time tag will be noted. All essays to be rubric scored by the Health Science Admissions Team.

- ✓ After rubric scoring, *successful* candidates will be notified no later than 5pm, 2 July 2021, to move forward to Phase 3.
- ✓ Completing the Phase 2 requirement does not guarantee advancement to the next phase.

PHASE 3: ACEMAPP PERSONAL PROFILE 05 July - 16 July 2021

MA candidates invited to Phase 3 will be required to create an account with ACEMAPP and begin the admissions process of your **criminal history background check & urine drug screen**. You will receive specific instructions in your Phase 3 notification addressing how to complete Phase 3; IE: program specific access code for the above-mentioned criminal background check / drug screen / and Phase 4 Clinical Requirements Tracker

Phase 3 completion deadline: 1159 AM (midnight), 16 July 2021 Planning ahead is essential!

- Please note: it may take up to 4 days for your submissions to be reviewed and accepted by ACEMAPP Plan accordingly. <u>Submit early to meet the timeline</u>
- Phase 3 & 4 requirements will have been discussed at the Mandatory Info Session on 26 June 2021

- Consideration of Phase 3 requirements will be accepted only if candidate has attended the mandatory meeting and successfully completed Phase 2.
- Reminder: You are required to pass the criminal history background check & urine drug/alcohol screen. Failure to do so will preclude you from moving into Phase 4 of the application / admission process.
- Marijuana use (medical or recreational) will mean failure to pass the UDS. Marijuana is legal on the State level but remains illegal on the Federal level and unacceptable for use by healthcare systems
- ✓ All expenses incurred during Phases 3 & 4 are at the MA program candidates' expense. Candidates will not receive refunds from Clackamas Community College or ACEMAPP for failure successfully pass or complete any Phase of the application process

Submit official documentation of Phase 4 Clinical Requirements provided to you at the Mandatory Information Session and confirmed in your conditional admittance to the MA Program. All Clinical Requirement documentation must be presented and approved by ACEMAPP no later than 18 August 2021.

Timely completion of all Phase 4 requirements is essential to advance to the final admissions review phase of the MA application process. Should the candidate not meet the above deadline, he/she may be placed on the wait list.
