

Clackamas Community College offers many options to help students fund their education:

Financial Aid — Most students qualify for some type of financial aid. Get started by filing your Free Application for Federal Student Aid online at www.fafsa.ed.gov . If you have questions or need help with your FAFSA, attend one of our Financial Aid advising sessions the first Thursday of every month from 3-4pm in room 117 of Rook Hall or email your questions to finaid@clackamas.edu .

Work Study — Work on campus and get a paycheck! Apply for financial aid and indicate on the FAFSA that you would like work study. Work study jobs at CCC start at \$9 an hour and these earnings do not count against you on next year's FAFSA. To see the current work study jobs visit: <http://depts.clackamas.edu/career/>.

Scholarships — Clackamas Community College awards more than \$400,000 in scholarships each year. And the scholarships aren't just for honor roll students. CCC scholarships are open to students with at least a 2.0 GPA, who are taking six or more credit hours. Visit www.clackamas.edu/scholarships for information.

Tuition Waivers — Get involved! Tuition waivers are available to qualified students in a variety of activities and departments at CCC. For example, officers in the Associated Student Government (ASG) receive tuition waivers for up to 15 credits. Waivers are available through Athletics, Music, Student Leadership, Performing Arts and more. Contact an advisor in your area of interest to learn more.

Department Internships — College credit may be available for qualified students working in department internships. The internships are awarded by the departments to students in financial need or those who have demonstrated a specific skill or talent in that department's specialty. Please check with departments for details.

Textbook and Childcare Grants — The ASG and the CCC Foundation offer assistance to help meet the challenges of childcare and textbook expenses. Need-based grants for textbooks and childcare are available fall, winter and spring terms. Veterans — If you are a veteran, member of the Reserves or National Guard, and plan to take classes, you may be eligible for educational benefits through the Veterans' Administration. Benefits may also be available to eligible spouses and/or children of veterans. Check your eligibility status by calling 1-800-827-1000.
