CCC Names New Director of Allied Health

OREGON CITY – Dr. Kim L. Hyatt has been named the new director of Allied Health and Special Programs for Clackamas Community College’s thriving Health Sciences Division. She started work at the college in December.

Hyatt is a native of Prineville, Ore., who has spent the past several years in health promotion and education in Utah. She was program director for health education and assistant professor at Weber State University in Ogden. She is a Certified Health Education Specialist, Certified Rape Victim Advocate, and has a certification in alcohol and drug dependencies. She earned her doctorate at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City in Health Promotion & Education.

Hyatt earned her bachelor’s degree at the University of Oregon where she was named an All American Track and Field athlete four times, the first woman javelin thrower in National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) history awarded honors for four consecutive years.

At CCC, Hyatt will manage several Allied Health programs including the clinical lab assistant, emergency medical technician, medical assistant and dental assistant. The college is looking at expanding its health science offerings as the division prepares for a move later this year to new quarters at CCC’s Harmony campus.

“I’m incredibly excited about the opportunities I’ve seen here. There’s great collaboration, not just at the college, but in the community as well,” Hyatt said.
