### STEP V LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Submit at least TWO and no more than three letters of recommendation. Letters of recommendation must be:

- Written on letterhead
- Signed
- Typed, written and dated within the last year
- Addressed to the Scholarship Selection Committee

Letters of recommendation must be from college officials, instructors, advisors, counselors, employers, co-workers, church officials, someone in your field of study, and/or anyone you know that holds a professional title (excluding family members). They must be able to discuss your:

- Current academic status
- Academic and extracurricular achievements
- Personal qualities, such as motivation, leadership, and commitment
- Potential for future success

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## STEP VI UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

Include with your application a current unofficial high school or college transcript. Students who have a GED or High School Equivalency should provide a copy of the certificate. Home School Students provide a copy of your Confirmation of Enrollment letter on file at your local EDS.

## STEP VII HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

1. Complete and sign the application.
2. Attach documents to the application in the following order:
  - a. Personal Statement
  - b. Two letters of Recommendation (Caution: certain scholarships require more than 2)
  - c. Unofficial Transcript
  - d. Any additional essays or documents that are required by certain scholarships
3. Do not attach certificate of awards or any other documents that are not required.
4. Make sure your name is on all the documents.

Note: All documents submitted become the property of CCC and will not be returned to students.

## STEP VIII WHERE TO SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

**Local High School Seniors:** Your completed applications must be submitted to your High School Counseling/ Career Office by April 30.

**All others: Mail or Deliver to:** Clackamas Community College, Student Financial Aid Office, 19600 Molalla Avenue, Oregon City, OR 97045. Completed applications must be received by 5 p.m. April 30, or the 1st business day following.

- Students concurrently enrolled in high school during the time period for which this scholarship would be utilized, are not eligible.
- Full-time employees of Clackamas Community College and their dependents are not eligible.
