What is a student budget/cost of attendance (COA)? Cost of Attendance figures are used for budgeting purposes only and represent an estimate of projected costs for the coming academic year. ## How does CCC calculate COA? Tuition & Fees Calculations (full time calculation)

Tuition: \$117 per credit x 15 credits = \$1755 tuition only

Fees: \$11.00 per credit x 15 credits = \$165

General Fee: \$30 per term



Tuition and fees for one term at CCC are approximately: \$1950\*\*

Books - This is an average amount you might spend on books and supplies.

Room and Board - CCC is considered a commuter campus. Room and board are based on the cost of an apartment located within Clackamas County, as well as utilities and food. This is based on a coed situation. Documentation will be required if a student believes that their costs exceed the budget estimation.

**Transportation -** Transportation is for gas/fuel, insurance and maintenance of a vehicle, or alternative commuting costs such as bus pass or fare.

Personal - This is an estimate of what you might spend during the school year on personal items, clothing, recreation and travel.

What if these amounts do not truly reflect a student's COA? - Students can ask for an exception to increase their cost of attendance if they can provide documentation for the following reasons: computer (one-time only), dependent care, medical expenses, necessary travel costs for out-of-state students, program cost/supplies, and disability expenses.
