Who Benefits From Sponsorship?

- K-5 grade classes from schools in Clackamas County
- Several schools are comprised of 30-70% non-white students.
 21-93% of students in most of the Clackamas County School District are allocible for fine and where the school school
- Districts are eligible for free and reduced lunch.
 Poverty rates are quite high in some communities (For example: Gladstone-25%, Mulino-16%).
- Low-income, coupled with low college going rates, can result in generational poverty and a lack of environmental awareness or stewardship.

Middle/High School students from schools with similar populations as listed above.

- We work with programs such as AVID or ASPIRE, which help close the achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success.
- These students often would be the first in their family to attend college and are from groups traditionally underrepresented in higher education.

What Do Sponsorship Dollars Support? Watershed Health Field Trips at the ELC:

- LET'S GET DUCKY: Discovering wetland wildlife (grades K-1)
- WELCOME HOME: Exploring wetland and forest habitats (grades 2-3)
- HEALTHY WATERSHEDS: How do we get there? (grades 4-5)

Water Industry Career Exploration:

These hands on field trips introduce students to three professionals working in careers related to the water industry. Students work with the professionals on activities that will lead to increased awareness of their own aptitudes and career interests. This type of career exposure is known to increase the likelihood of students attending college in the future, which empowers them as future environmental advocates and decision makers.

Nature Spy Explorer Kits:

These kits have all the supplies needed for children to learn, create, and play - engaging crafts, fun facts, playful activities and a book connected to the kit's theme (e.g. Insects or Birds) - helping children to discover the natural world around them.
