NRS-230 CLINICAL PHARMACOLOGY I, 3 CREDITS

This course introduces the theoretical background that enables students to provide safe and effective care related to drugs and natural products to persons throughout the lifespan. It includes the foundational concepts of principles of pharmacology, nonopioid analgesics, and antibiotics, as well as additional classes of drugs. Students will learn to make selected clinical decisions in the context of nursing regarding using current, reliable sources of information, understanding of pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics, developmental physiologic considerations, monitoring and evaluating the effectiveness of drug therapy, teaching persons from diverse populations regarding safe and effective use of drugs and natural products, intervening to increase therapeutic benefits and reduce potential negative effects, and communicating appropriately with other health professionals regarding drug therapy. Drugs are studied by therapeutic or pharmacological class using an organized framework.

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NUR-100 NURSING ASSISTANT I, 6.5 CREDITS

This course provides the student with the skills to perform basic level nursing care. Certified Nursing Assistants are defined by law as people who assist licensed nursing personnel in the provision of nursing care. Prepares the student to perform routine nursing assistant tasks to clients in sub-acute care settings as well as in the community. Includes didactic and skills lab instruction. Major topics covered include: collaboration with health care team, communication & interpersonal skills, person-centered care, infection control and prevention, safety and emergency procedures, assisting with activities of daily living, mental health and social service needs of clients, technical skills, acquiring observation and reporting skills, documentation of care provided and end-of-life care. Upon successful completion of this course, students may apply for the Oregon State Board of Nursing certification exam for nursing assistants (CNA 1).
