To be considered for formal program admittance, students must complete a series of prerequisite courses prior to the program starting. The Medical Billing and Coding Program accepts 24 students per cohort. Classes start in Winter term and are offered remotely and online.

NOTE: Students may apply while taking pre-requisite courses during Fall term, however, their application status will be “conditionally accepted” and the student will be placed on a waiting list. Any student who completes prerequisites during Fall term will be accepted in order they apply to fill any remaining open program seats.

Student Success with Online Courses

The MBC Program is designed for online and remote learning. The online courses require students to have strong computer skills (examples below):

- using Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint, and Google Docs;
- saving and uploading documents;

- using email, and avoiding phishing attempts;
- attaching documents to emails;
- navigating the Internet; recognizing credible, safe information;
- searching for career and job information;
- understanding the impact of your digital footprint;

APPLICATION PROCESS AND REQUIREMENTS

Step 1: Review all information provided on the website prior to applying.

Step 2: Meeting program academic prerequisites

To be eligible for the program, students must meet the following academic requirements:

- BI-120 Introduction to Human Anatomy and Physiology
- or BI-231 Human Anatomy & Physiology I
 - & BI-232 and Human Anatomy & Physiology II
 - & BI-233 and Human Anatomy & Physiology III
- HP-110 Medical Terminology
- WR-101 Workplace Writing or WR-121Z Composition I

Note: If you have taken pre-requisite courses at another institution, you will be asked to upload your unofficial transcripts in the program application. If you need assistance with course placement assessment (e.g., MTH or WR) or have general questions regarding the program, please schedule an appointment with the admissions team at welcome@clackamas.edu.

Step 3: Apply to the program

Note: Conditionally accepted students will be invited to participate in a mandatory orientation on Zoom. More information will be provided in acceptance letters.
