Thank you for your interest in the Clackamas Community College Medical Billing and Coding Program. We are happy that you are interested in Medical Billing and Coding as potential careers.

The Medical Billing and Coding program will consist of 3 terms of study including insurance billing, medical coding and other core classes to strengthen your skills for these careers (*please see attached curriculum*). In each term, an overall grade of "C" must be maintained in each course in order to remain in the program.

Throughout this program, students will be exposed to the knowledge to prepare them to sit for the following national certification exams through the AAPC: Certified Professional Biller (CPB) and Certified Professional Coder (CPC). There is an extra charge for these examinations paid directly to the AAPC. AAPC Membership is required.

Begin your application process as early as possible so that you have ample time to complete the packet and requirements. Please review the contents of this application packet thoroughly prior to submitting your application and supporting documents. CCC Admission Policy Statement

Clackamas Community College supports an open door policy and welcomes all students who can benefit from the instruction offered, regardless of their educational background. Prospective students are eligible for admission if they are a high school graduate or have a GED. Admission to the College does not guarantee entrance to all programs. Students seeking to enter a special admit program must meet additional admission criteria. Any student that does not meet the above criteria will not be admitted into the 2022 MBC program.

Program

The Medical Billing and Coding Program is designed to prepare students for entry level positions in a front office healthcare setting. The goal of the Clackamas Community College Medical Billing and Coding Program is to graduate students that have demonstrated competencies in administrative practices as well as demonstrated work ethics and professional values consistent with that of the American Academy of Professional Coders (AAPC).

The program consists of three terms of study. Applicants are advised that a student who has strong reading comprehension skills, enjoys science and math, has the ability to multi-task, and a high degree of attention to detail are required for the successful completion of this program.

Certification

Certification is through the American Academy of Professional Coders (AAPC). The national certification exam(s) and AAPC membership are not included in this program and are a separate charge, paid directly to the AAPC. For more information please visit www.aapc.com.

ADMISSIONS

- **Eligibility for admission to the Medical Billing and Coding** program will be based on meeting the stated criteria. Spaces are limited **to a 24 seat** cohort starting Winter term 2022; therefore, eligibility does not guarantee admission to the program. Submitting an application does not guarantee that applicants have satisfied minimum criteria.

- Admission criteria are subject to change from year to year. It is the responsibility of the student to be informed.

The following items must be supplied when requested without exception. Failure to follow the process and outlined timelines will result in not being considered for admission.

- \$10.00 application fee. Checks, Money Orders, or Cashier's Checks are acceptable forms of payment and should be made out to Clackamas Community College.
- This checklist.
- Official College Transcripts: Students must have completed the program preparatory courses: WR-121, MA-110, and BI-120 to be eligible to apply for the program. CCC transcripts do not need to be included.
 - ✓ Only completed application packets will be processed allowing applicants to be considered for program admission.
 - ✓ All application supporting documents are required regardless of age, educational background or experience.
 - ✓ September 24, 2021: Successful candidates will receive an email notification of program admission.
 - ✓ **Please take the time, even though you do not know if you will be admitted, to fill out your FAFSA (financial aid) eligibility information as soon as allowable for application year.
