Medical Billing and Coding - Clackamas Community College Harmony Campus, Milwaukie, OR

In order to be considered for formal program admittance, students must complete a series of prerequisite courses prior to the application closing. The Medical Billing and Coding Program accepts 24 students per cohort and classes start in Winter term and are offered remotely and online.

Students may apply while taking pre-requisite courses during Fall term, however, their application status will be 'conditionally accepted' and student will be placed on a waiting list. Any student who completes pre-requisites during Fall term and are conditionally accepted will be placed in a lottery to fill any remaining open program seats.

Step 2: Meeting program academic prerequisites

In order to be eligible for the program, students must meet the following academic requirements:

- BI-120 Introduction to Human Anatomy and Physiology or BI-231 Human Anatomy & Physiology I
 - & BI-232 and Human Anatomy & Physiology II
 - & BI-233 and Human Anatomy & Physiology III
- HP-110 Medical Terminology
- WR-101 Workplace Writing or WR-121Z Composition I

Note: If you have taken pre-requisite courses at another institution, you will be asked to upload your unofficial transcripts in the program application.
