Program Cost

College Tuition and Fees

- ♣ Tuition = \$777.00 (2021-22 year)
- ♣ Fees = \$407.00 (2021-22 year)

Additional Program Costs

- Criminal background check and Drug Screen = \$76.00
- ♣ ACEMAPP modules for clinical placement = \$50.00
- Proof of immunization/vaccines (cost varies)
- ♣ Supplies from bookstore = ~\$347.00
- Uniform: Wine colored scrubs, nursing shoes, watch with a second hand (cost varies)

Limited Entry Program

Only the first 10* Students will be admitted

- Must pass/complete ALL academic (prerequisites) and non-academic requirements prior to entry
- Make sure there are no holds on your CCC account.

*Due to COVID-19 restrictions.



Academic Pre-requisites

- ☐ Unofficial transcript with WRD-098 (C or higher grade)
 - Math-050 or higher (C or higher grade) is strongly recommended

<u>OR</u>

- □ Placement scores from testing center placing into Writing-121
 - □ Placement into Math-050 or higher (C or higher grade) is strongly recommended



Non-Academic Requirements

Oregon Health Authority Rules for Students in Clinical Training include the following:

- ☐ Drug Screen
- ☐ Proof of immunization status (vaccines records)

 MMR, HepB, Tdap, Varicella, COVID
- ☐ TB test

Quantiferon gold or T-Spot or TB Skin Test

■ BLS/CPR Certification*

*Must be: American Heart Association BLS Provider Card or certificate of completion.



Non-Academic Requirements

- Must be at least 18 years old
- Note: Clinical sites (employers) now require the COVID vaccine
 - If you are not planning on getting vaccinated, know that you may be barred from entering clinical sites, which in turn may hinder your completion of the course.

Non-Academic Requirements

"What if I don't have my BLS/CPR card, where can I go to obtain certification training?"

BLS/CPR training can be found:

- **AHA BLS Course Options**
- Note: The only accepted certification for CPR is through the American Heart Association (AHA).



Personal Health & Course Safety

- COVID-19 Guidelines: Students/faculty must follow the college Return to Campus Guidelines and students/faculty must follow clinical facility guidelines to identify and to prevent infection from the virus.
- Strength and Mobility: Must not have physical limitations or be under the care of a physician or on Workman's Compensation due to musculoskeletal injury.
- ♣ Endurance: Sufficient to complete 8.5 hours of clinical with acceptable speed to care for 4 6 residents.
