INFORMATION FOR EMPLOYEES THAT MAY RECEIVE REPORTS OF SEX-BASED MISCONDUCT

- Believe survivors
- Offer support and share this document to guide the victim to resources
- Encourage the victim to speak with a Title IX Coordinator, who can review all the options with them. Reporting to a Title IX coordinator does not automatically initiate an investigation.
- For Classified and Faculty employees, reporting incidents or allegations of sex-based misconduct to a Title IX coordinator is optional, with the following exceptions:
 - Allegations involving employees must be reported
 - In cases of child abuse, all CCC employees must immediately report the suspected abuse or abuser to local law enforcement or the local Division of Human Services office.

• College administrators and other Designated Responsible Employees are obligated to report any information regarding allegations of sexbased discrimination to a Title IX Coordinator as soon as becoming aware of the incident.
